- Auditioning/selecting students for the Concert Band in conjunction with Music staff.

- Plan and prepare for rehearsals and performances throughout the year.
- Liaise with HOD Music and music administrator around attendance. Keep accurate rolls and follow up attendance. Discuss any concerns about student attendance with HOD.
- Inspire and encourage students in learning music. Adopt a professional and positive manner in teaching students.
- Engage in department wide initiatives to provide a diverse range of opportunities for students focusing on excellence through a positive learning environment.
- Engage in department wide initiatives to grow our instrumental programme

- Be a qualified and experienced musician with experience as a conductor of concert bands
- Have full registration or hold a current LAT for 2024.
- Share in the philosophy of the school and the importance of Music as an important part of education.

- Place a high value on working in a collaborative environment, contributing positively to decision making within the department.
